- 14. Articles must be made by an exhibitor. Articles not made by exhibitors may be entered for DISPLAY ONLY if space permits. Check with appropriate Division Chairman or Board Member.
- 15. The Chairman of each division will be responsible for the placement of all entries for judging. Placement according to division or class will be determined by the chairman.
- 16. The Chairman has the authority to add classes and sections in their divisions.
- 17. The subject matter of the exhibits must be suitable for family viewing, under the discretion of the Creative Arts Directors.





# **Contest Rules:**

This contest activity will last one hour. As a large group, the contestants will attend a 30-minute crash course on flower arranging from a local floral design professional. Then the individual contestants will be challenged to design a mason jar fresh floral arrangement. The floral arrangements will then be judged starting at 5 p.m. Contestants are required to provide their pruning shears and/or scissors. The only other accepted items to bring are gloves and/or an apron. All other materials will be provided.

# **Judging & Prizes:**

Judging Standards will be based on the following design principles of Balance, Dominance, Contrast, Rhythm, Proportion, and Scale. Each contestant will be awarded a Blue Supreme, a Red Excellent, or a White Great ribbon. The Blue Supreme winners will then compete for a large Best in Show Rosette.
